

Grosse Pointe Woods

Grosse Pointe Woods was originally incorporated in 1927 as the Village of Lochmoor. Subsequently it became the Village of Grosse Pointe Woods in 1939 and the City of Grosse Pointe Woods in 1950. Grosse Pointe Woods' growth began after World War II. Located in this 3.3 square mile city is a vibrant community, a state-of-the-art library, a busy shopping and restaurant district on Mack Avenue, a beautiful waterfront park on Lake St. Clair featuring one of the largest swimming pools in the Midwest, a water slide, marina, activity center, as well as walking paths and picnic areas. With other parks and baseball fields nestled among the beautiful tree-lined streets, like all other Grosse Pointe communities, Grosse Pointe Woods is proud of its outstanding municipal services, excellent community spirit, outstanding health care and educational venues.

Grosse Pointe Park

Grosse Pointe Park is home to approximately 12,000 residents who share fabulous neighborhood parks that feature a theatre, fitness center, tennis courts, volleyball, Olympic-size swimming pool, playgrounds, municipal marina, seasonal ice rink with warming hut, community center, picnic grounds, soothing fountains and garden trails and shoreline wooden boardwalks where you'll find a variety of birds and watch Great Lakes freighters as they ply their way across Lake St. Clair. The Park is proud of its French beginnings, evidenced by many of the historically significant names. Nationally registered historic homes blend in with beautiful newly constructed homes to majestically grace the Lake St. Clair shoreline. The Kercheval business section is popular for its unique boutique shopping, dining and galleries, as well as its West Farmers Market that offers seasonal produce and flowers during the summer and fall months.
